

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, you know, Senator Bromm, that's going to be up to the Department of Education, I'd certainly visit with them.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. So you haven't any particular position on the weight of those categories really?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, if you could tell me the number of schools that have applied and other criteria, you know, I could tell you what I would do. Now that doesn't mean they'd be under the rules and regulations of the state department.

SENATOR BROMM: Right. Now, is it...if a district has ten buildings that don't have hookup or ten buildings to be connected, let's put it that way, and...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Ten classroom buildings.

SENATOR BROMM: Yeah, and another...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Okay.

SENATOR BROMM: ...district has two, would you think that the one with ten would have a greater chance of getting the grant than the one with two?

SENATOR ROBINSON: Are you talking about the initial hookup?

SENATOR BROMM: Right.

SENATOR ROBINSON: I don't think with just one hookup, but after that I think they would...

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, okay.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...because the number of buildings is a criteria.

SENATOR BROMM: Frankly, as I started to look at this and think about it, I thought you know maybe the larger districts with more classroom buildings would have a greater chance of getting the money and...

SENATOR ROBINSON: That's what I said, after the first hookup.
