

SENATOR BROMM: ...and I guess I shouldn't think that would be the case. I mean I should not think that just because they're larger and have more buildings that they necessarily should have a priority.

SENATOR ROBINSON: But you told me there were two school districts.

SENATOR BROMM: Right, I was just...

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, well...

SENATOR BROMM: ...hypothetical.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...now my answer might have been different if there were 10, or 20, or 40, or 50.

SENATOR BROMM: Okay. I guess the thing that I...that I'm trying to clarify is whether or not, if you have a greater number of buildings that aren't served, whether or not that puts you into a higher priority for the fund than if you're a small district and you only have one or two buildings to begin with.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Yeah, but that's not...that would not pertain to the hookup.

SENATOR BROMM: It wouldn't?

SENATOR ROBINSON: No,...

SENATOR BROMM: Okay, then...

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...not in my...

SENATOR BROMM: ...clarify that, what you mean on whether or not it pertains to the hookup.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Well, if you're talking about what I would do, if there are two buildings, one is with 2 and one with 15,...

SENATOR BROMM: Um-huh.

SENATOR ROBINSON: ...depending if there...say there's money, of course depends how much money is available. How much money is
