

isn't that we don't feel strongly about that, in fact with the decline of the boot camp, with the pressure on our prison facilities, those are very important and we felt quite strongly about those. However, we realize there's another year when we can look at them more carefully. But I will indicate at this time if our present population continues at this time we will be back next year looking at those much more closely, that's the two again that we did not recommend for override, because we do have 1996 to look at them. They would serve a very valuable purpose, by the way, in the future if we were to do that. But for the sake of being frugal, I guess you could say, we are not proposing to override that this year, but we will be looking at it very carefully next year. And I simply want to warn you that it will be very vital, we think, that we will need to do that in another year. But for the present let it suffice to say that we recommend the two at Beatrice, \$360,000 each year, and the 25...complete...with the study, the comprehensive study for the school at Curtis by returning the other \$25,000 for that \$50,000 study. That school, by the way, is on a strong track, it's making a strong come back, it's very important and vital to the agricultural community. There is increasing enrollment, Senator Elmer can probably speak to that. But we feel it's a very vital cog in Nebraska's educational system, it's proven itself in recent years that it can come back, and with a new person on board it is appropriate that we satisfactorily fund the study. So we recommend the override on those two issues. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I didn't realize I pushed my button this early. But I'm probably going to have one talk on all the overrides, so I might as well make it now and be done with it. I'm not going to support this particular override. Two weeks ago I had it presumed that I would probably vote for most overrides, simply looking at the green sheet, the tally of where we are, you can make a very defensible position that we're within the budget limits. There is one that I would probably override out of all the vetoes, and that would be probably the first year for salary adjustments, for the simple reason that those are contracts at a reasonable level, at least the first year, is that...well, it's all at a reasonable level, but I would override at least the first year because I feel an obligation to follow that commitment of a contract that the state has for those salary adjustments and not be...any agency be put in a position where they either have to
