

savings, any one of those would have not been vetoed, I think then there would be every justification not to do any. But for those reasons I will not be voting for this amendment and probably several others. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, because I'm working on something, I'm going to...well, I may as well take a minute or two and then I can put my light on again anyway. This is one time every word Senator Warner said, to my ear, was very clear. And he touched a very responsive cord with me, and I touched on it, I think, when I was talking about the judges salary and how their...the whole judicial budget, including the raise for the judges, is going to be funded, and other agencies are hit in this way, which I think is unfair. I had told Senator Maurstad that I would vote for an override on these cottages. LB 391 is the only bill we're going to deal with today. I wanted to ask Senator...I'll ask Senator Maurstad a question because he is a member of the inner circle.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Maurstad.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: The elite brigade.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes, Senator Maurstad...the what brigade?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: The elite brigade, according to one of our...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, I thought you said Satan's brigade, I was going to say you can't use that without my authorization. But what is the committee going to do with reference to the university in terms of recommending anything in the way of an override?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: I have no idea, Senator, because the committee has not met relative to the other appropriation bills that have been vetoed, so I don't have...I just don't know.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Now, you are a rookie, as far as being in the Legislature, but you are very wise in the ways of how things are done in a political setting, especially being the former Mayor of the 14th largest metropolis in the State of Nebraska.

SENATOR MAURSTAD: Twelfth. (Laughter.)
