

SENATOR JENSEN: Then my last question is that, again, in the DAS form there is \$649,500 but yet you, or not you, but the appropriation here is for 360 twice or 720,000, a 61,000 dollar difference. Where does that come into play?

SENATOR MAURSTAD: That's an excellent question, Senator Jensen, and that came about because the current...the one that is being renovated now gave them an idea of what the actual costs were. What you see before you is an estimate so we're using actual costs that...under construction now as a better estimate and, as a result, the amount appropriated was increased.

SENATOR JENSEN: Okay, but...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR JENSEN: ...when you had come to me and I told you that I would...I would certainly think about supporting this I also respect Senator Warner and his comments, but it would seem to me that if we have buildings where disabled people are...are placed at and yet they do not meet ADA standards, I don't know that really the State of Nebraska has a choice because these are federal standards that are set forth and I would think that the federal government could say they must be done, period. So, thank you, Senator Maurstad, for your comments. I will certainly consider this when it comes time to vote. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Jensen. Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Madam President and members, I just punched my light on as a result of Senator Jensen asking for some clarification regarding the list and the place on the list of the Beatrice State Homes, and, as Chairman of the 309 Committee, let me share just a few things with you. It wasn't until a couple of years ago that 309 was expected to do, in fact, ADA and fire life safety. In fact, in the proposed budget for '95-96 we were hoping to get \$7,700,000 each year. Well, we didn't. We wound up getting for the two years about 5,800,000, which left us short. When you do that you change the list of priorities. You can't do what you would like to do and it's unfair to shift to 309 what should be legitimate...legitimate capital construction programs. You know, for example, for example, the Kennard House, have you ever seen that yellow, old
