SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. We turn to Item 5, motions to override, gubernatorial vetoes. Mr. Clerk, first measure.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 392, mainline appropriations bill. I have a report from the Appropriations Committee. Senator Wehrbein would move to override certain line-items as provided for in LB 392. Senator, are copies being distributed?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

CLERK: Very good, thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Wehrbein, to open on the motion filed by the Appropriations Committee.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Senator Withem, members of the body, can I ask how many are here right now, Senator Withem?

SPEAKER WITHEM: You can ask. Let me check just a moment and we'll see how many people have checked in. Senator Wehrbein, what we'd suggest maybe is you go ahead and open and we'll get a more accurate count. At this point we have the 25 listed, but others have come in since then and we're not sure exactly how many.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Okay. Well I would like to explain, I assume that this is what we're here for and so I'd like to have as many people hear what the Appropriations Committee has recommended, if at all possible, including the philosophy behind what we are recommending. What we are recommending is being passed out. It's a sheet that says a single motion to override and we list several in LB 392 which is first on your list. Then we also go to LB 389 which is a salary bill and move to override on that bill, so there's going to be two different votes if everything would go according to the way we recommended it, recognizing there may be some other options offered.
