

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, yes...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If we get around to it.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...that's typical decisions because we have to prioritize to a degree, so...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Can you see where some of us might...well let me not say us...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, I can understand where people would disagree, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that maybe I would see the domestic violence program as having a higher priority than this 1-H and FFA premiums.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I could understand that you could feel that way, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And maybe I would even see it as more important than doing some kind of opening of facilities at Geneva and Kearney because we're dealing with people with the domestic violence program and in the Kearney/Geneva area we are too, but there's less of a direct impact. What I'm saying, you would understand that reasonable people can differ in terms of the priorities that were adopted by the Appropriations Committee in putting their package together.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, because we had even disagreed among ourselves for a short time,...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: For a short...oh, because...

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: ...if not a long time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Did you unanimously agree on this package?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, we did.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Was that so that there would be the united front or there was actually an overcoming of all the objections that the various members had?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: A little of both.
