

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Senator Brashear.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Yes, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are there items in addition to those in the package which you will vote to override?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well so that we maintain a strategic in balance here, I'll say I don't know yet.

What would be the determining factor for you?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: Well the first determining factor, Senator Chambers, would be if we could muster 30 votes and maybe including yours for the package the Appropriations Committee is suggesting and then we can talk about the motions that follow. That's the procedure.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: What I'm saying, presuming that the package is adopted, that's what I should have started with. If this package is adopted intact, are there other items not contained in it which you would vote to override?

SENATOR BRASHEAR: There are other items which I will consider the override of if this package is adopted, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But you probably would not, is that correct? Okay, thank you.

SENATOR BRASHEAR: No, I don't think that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, thank you. Senator Lynch, is Senator Lynch here? Okay. Members of the Legislature, I may as well ask Senator Hillman because she's a member of that committee even though she may not have done a lot in this. Senator Hillman, may I ask you a question?
