

SENATOR HILLMAN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: If this package is accepted intact by the Legislature, are there items not included in it which you would vote to override?

SENATOR HILLMAN: There would be some items that I probably would, Senator Chambers. I will tell you that as a member of the Appropriations Committee there are items in here that I don't particularly approve of as an override, but I thought it was important that the Appropriations Committee put together a package rather than individual things that they would look at kind of a balance in some overrides that perhaps would create better (inaudible)...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR HILLMAN: ...and that there will be also a lot of discussion by a lot of senators because we go back again to what my priorities are, what your priorities are, Senator Bohlke's priorities and they're all a little different. So that's where the debate will be and the votes is I think is what we feel is really important, what we feel makes really good government and that's going to play down differently for each of us.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator Hillman. I heard, I think, Senator Lynch clear his throat. Senator Lynch, I would ask you the question, if the package is adopted intact, are there items not included which you would vote to override?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Lynch.

SENATOR LYNCH: Oh, I could probably take the fifth on that one.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I know.

SENATOR LYNCH: But to tell you the truth and as far as I'm concerned, I think the things that are included in the veto which I will support, this first portion of the veto like DD, like pay equity, like mental health are a heck of a lot more important than the probation officers.
