SENATOR CHAMBERS: More so than the Domestic Violence Program, Voc Rehab and some of the others that were mentioned. Correct?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: All things considered, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You're getting cagey, Senator Wehrbein. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers has completed his closing. The question before the body now is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the override motion. All those in favor of the Chambers amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. While people are recording their votes let me announce while the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and do sign LR 140. (See page 2761 of the Legislative Journal.) Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk. A record vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 2762 of the Legislative Journal.) 10 ayes, 28 nays on the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is not adopted. Mr. Clerk, is there another amendment?

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend. (FA367 appears on page 2763 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers, you are recognized to open. You'll be given 10 minutes for your opening, by the way.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. And, members of the Legislature, what this motion does is to omit from the Appropriations Committee motion all items except that described as Section 45 whose purpose is to restore School for the Deaf funding during the transition. That would be \$300,000. If the amendment I'm offering is adopted, that is the only item which would remain in this Appropriations motion pack, motion in terms of adopting their package. On our desk was an article from the Omaha World-Herald, and I was beaten to the punch on this one, dated June 1, 1995, and it's...the initials are RRW. Senator Wehrbein, I'd like to ask you a question.
