

SEN TOR BROWN: What our recommendation was was to cut their funding in the second year of the biennium to give them and to include this amount, the 300,000 that has been vetoed out for the first year of the biennium to allow them to develop their plans. By this fall they are supposed to have the plan in place for what they are going to do. I don't know if they were unable to secure a facility, they would probably have to come back to the Department of Education, the Department of Education would have to decide whether to ask for a deficit appropriation I suppose for the second year if they were unable to find space, but we really felt that by doing it this way and by including money for the transition that it would give them the time to do the right thing.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: In effect, will this money...(interruption)

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...for them from when this bill takes effect until fall of 1996, because that's when they start operations again I guess, or do they have children there year round?

SENATOR BROWN: I believe that they have children there year round.
