

ASSISTANT CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2763 of the Legislative Journal.) The vote is 2 ayes, 31 nays on Senator Chambers' motion, Mr. President.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: The motion and the amendment is not agreed to. Mr. Clerk, the next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Hall would move to amend the Appropriations Committee motion. (See FA368 found on pages 2763-64 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Mr. President, members. The amendment is one that, unlike Senator Chambers, and I am going to pass out a sheet that is not quite accurate, but it is what I have ready, and I will talk to you about it, and then we will go from there, but what it does is it adds in, as opposed to Senator Chambers who would strip out measures, since we are dealing with the package that the Appropriations Committee has, and it takes 30 votes to amend it, it takes 30 votes to override any veto, it makes sense to me to just try to add a few things back in that I would attempt to do, whether or not the package is successful or not. And I've circled them for you, but I did that prematurely, without first talking to Fiscal staff, and so there are a couple of changes that I need to explain to you. But I can tell you this much, and I know that this is absolutely accurate, that it would deal with these three areas. It would deal with the Supreme Court and the additional probation staff. Now that dollar figure that shows up there is \$334,713. The accurate figure there needs to be \$566,654, so you are looking at a figure of 566,654 for that program or Agency 05, Program 067, the additional probation staff. The second portion of the amendment deals with the Department of Ed. It deals with Program 351, Section 43, it is Voc Rehab aid, and that dollar figure is accurate. It is 750,000 that you see circled there. The third one is the Department of Social Services, and I only circled the domestic violence aid. That was inaccurate. It has got to include the entire program. The way it was vetoed, all of that has to go back in. It would be the...the figure at the bottom, 292,367. So to find the sum total, what we would have to do is we would have to take the 500,000, we would have to add that to the 750, and we'd have to add the 292,367, and that would give us a total of...it would be \$1,609,000, roughly,
