SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR HALL: ...should not be dealt with. They ought to, but I believe that this takes care of probably the greatest number of concerns if you listened to folks on the committee who said that, you know, I want to support this without actually saying it, and that's what I heard. I would hope that you will support this measure. It takes 30 votes, as you know, to amend it. But then I know that other proposals that I have on the bill go away if we can get this on the committee recommendation. We can adopt both of those and put LB 392 off the table for the rest of the day. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Hall. The question before the body now then is the adoption of the Hall amendment to the veto override motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. By the way, this does require 30 votes for adoption. Have you all voted?

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Could I ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: A roll call vote has been requested. Senator Bernard-Stevens, are you rising for a purpose?

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: In reverse order, reverse order.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The request has been for that to be in reverse order. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 2764 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to amend the override motion.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. The call is raised. Anything further, Mr. Clerk.
