

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You've heard the closing. The question is, shall this portion of LB 389 be overridden notwithstanding the objections of the Governor? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, I probably should have had a call of the house please.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR HALL: The house is under call. All members please return to their chairs, record their presence. All unauthorized personnel please leave the floor. Members who are outside the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence, the house is under call. Please look and see if your light is lit. We are looking for Senators Elmer and Wesely. Senator Coordsen, if you would check in please. Thank you very much. While we are waiting for members to return to the Chamber and record their presence, I would like to introduce a guest of Senator Beutler. It is Senator Don Sallee of Troy, Kansas. Senator Sallee is a senator in the Kansas Legislature, who is the Chair of the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee. I believe he is under the north balcony. If you would please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. Thank you for joining us today. Senator Wehrbein, I believe you need to check in if you would please. Senator Warner, Senator Wesely, Senator Janssen, the house is under call. Excuse me, Senator Jensen, Senator Janssen. Ah, the the other way, the "e" instead of the "a". Thank you very much.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Could we have a roll call vote in reverse order, please.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you very much. We are still looking for Senator Wesely and Elmer. We are looking for Senator Elmer. The house is under call. Senator Wehrbein, we are unable to locate Senator Elmer. We can begin the process. Senator Wehrbein says, Mr. Clerk, that we should begin our roll call vote in reverse order. Mr. Clerk.
