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getting to that or any bills below LB 371 on the agenda, if we really want to get to those then we can...I think then we need to take some action on a proactive basis to keep us from getting to the debate on that. I know there are those who are not necessarily enamored with the idea of suspending the rules to limit debate because there are those, I know, and I'm one of them, who has mixed feelings about whether we ought to go to midnight and then keep going. Maybe we ought to have a decision as far as whether we can pass legislation after midnight. I, personally, think we can and maybe that's...maybe we need to do it and get a court challenge. But if we're going to do that, let's be prepared for at least another ten hours because I think that's what it entails. I would urge that we...that we vote in favor of the suspension motion and go ahead and get with the debate reading and voting on each of these Final Reading bills.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Lindsay. Senator Beutler, your light is next.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Hall, members of the Legislature, Senator Withem, if I could ask you a quick question for clarification.

SENATOR HALL: Senator Withem. Senator Withem is present.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator the motion...the motion calls for the cessation of all motions. I assume that includes a motion to cease debate or a motion to call the question. Would that be accurate too?

SPEAKER WITHEM: Typically, excuse me. Typically, the type of motions you're talking about, things along the lines of ceasing debate, calling the question, call of the house, checking in, asking for a roll call vote, are along the lines of procedural types of motions, the types of motions that I intended and continue to intend and I believe the motion covers are those types of substantive motions which would return a bill to committee, would...would bracket, would return to Select File and would amend. I think Mason's Manual makes a distinction between the what I call substantive issue oriented types of motions as opposed to the ceasing debate and those other types of motions.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay, but just to clarify your intent, at the least the motion to sus...or the...the...well, the motion to
