I don't think the provisions are that good and I'm questioning whether Senator Kristensen has actually read the bill because he said there's good stuff in it too. Those were not his words, they were much more technical than that.

SENATOR HALL: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I don't think the bill is sound and I think it would be a mistake for the Legislature to enact it based on how poorly written, poorly thought out the bill itself is but the bracket motion gives an opportunity to do something with this bill other than either vote formally to make it fail on Final Reading or to withhold your votes and it also fail on Final Reading. Mr. President, are we still on Final Reading?

SENATOR HALL: Yes, we are, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then I would ask us to check in and I will ask for a roll call vote.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Will all members please check in, show their presence. We are on Final Reading. All members should be present and in their seats. Senators Avery, Lindsay, Matzke, Pedersen and Pirsch. Senator Engel, Senator Fisher, Senator Landis. Senators Fisher and Landis, we are on Final Reading. Senator Landis, we are on Final Reading, if you could return to the Chamber. Senator Chambers, Senator Landis is not in his office and can't be located. Can we proceed? Thank you very much. Mr. Clerk, call the roll on the question of whether or not to bracket LB 371.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote. See page 2777 of the Legislative Journal.) 9 ayes, 35 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to bracket.

SENATOR HALL: Motion to bracket fails. Anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing at this time, Mr. President.
