PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Schellpeper. Is there any discussion on the confirmation report? Seeing none, Senator Schellpeper waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the General Affairs confirmation report. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the confirmation report as offered by the General Affairs Committee.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The General Affairs confirmation report is adopted. The Health and Human Services Committee report.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely to open on the report.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Madam President and members, the Health and Human Services Committee did consider the appointment of a number of individuals to several different boards by the Governor. We recommend their approval. First, there's Jerry Hohbaum, the Commission for the Hearing Impaired; David Conway for the Commission for the Hearing Impaired; and Linsay Darnall for the Commission for the Hearing Impaired. These individuals were all recommended for that position. Timothy Bachenber who is a physician, I believe, was appointed to the Child Abuse Prevention Fund Board. Irene Fiesterman with the Rural Health Advisory Commission, and Janet Fletcher to the Rural Health Advisory Commission were both recommended as well. These are six individuals that we consider to be worthy of confirmation and we move that their appointments be confirmed by the Legislature.
