SENATOR KRISTENSEN: Thank you. Madam President and members of the Legislature, the following members appeared before the Transportation Committee: David L. Gilfillan for the Nebraska Railway Council; Marty McCullough for an appointment to the Nebraska Motor Vehicle Industry Licensing Board; also for that board Marlin Armbruster and James W. Budke appeared also as an appointment to that board. All of them did appear, satisfactorily answered the questions of the committee; appeared to have no conflicts of interest and showed a general willingness to participate and would like to be appointed. The committee voted unanimously to approve them and we would ask the Legislature also to approve their confirmation. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Kristensen. Is there any discussion on the Transportation Committee confirmation report? Seeing none, Senator Kristensen waives closing. The question before you is the adoption of the Transportation Committee confirmation report. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the confirmation report as offered by the Transportation Committee.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Transportation Committee confirmation report is adopted. We now turn to legislative resolutions, agenda Item 11. The legislative resolutions to be addressed collectively. The Chair recognizes Senator Withem.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Yes, Senator Chambers, this is a motion to suspend the rules, listen closely, listen carefully. The rule that is being suspended is the rule that requires a layover of resolutions after they have been introduced. There are a couple of resolutions honoring high school athletic teams that were just introduced today. So, rather than have those lay over and be read the first day next January, this motion is to allow resolu...LR 274 and LR 275 to be included within this group.
