But, you see, these Jewish people, when you see 6 million people exterminated like rodents and when he...I know in the last month you have seen on television again when our troops walked into Dachau, to Auschwitz, to all of those camps and saw the horror that we knew existed sort of. We were vaguely aware that this is hap...was happening. I know that you can't turn your backs on that and say, no, it never happened, and these people that have these neo-Nazi cells, if you want to call it now, and this organization, even though Lauck has been arrested and is in Denmark now, the Germans are trying to extradite him to Germany. Even though he isn't here, the activities continue and Iowa has a group that works at it. They're all over the country. The German people are trying to live it down and it worries and concerns German people that because of our laws on free speech that these people may continue their activities. So, because...I wish that the Legislature had been in session the night of the holocaust observance because when you listen to the people who are survivors of the holocaust, one woman has a terrible scar on her face where she was cut with a glass, when you listen to them and see them light the candle, you understand that this is something that even though it was 50 years ago it is still a living occurrence with us, we still feel, and that is just one of the many things that happens in the world and has happened in the world over the years. All kinds of people have been hurt by discrimination and by hate. I watched "Out of Ireland" last night. All of my forebears are Irish. What a terrible feeling when you go to look for a job and it says, No Irish May Apply. Blacks had to go, African-Americans have to go and use a separate water fountain in the south, and in the north it might not have been so obvious but the discrimination was there. And in the responsive benediction at the holocaust observance one of the things that everyone participates in is a list of when they came to the communists I didn't speak up because I was a communist, when I didn't speak up because I wasn't a Jew, because I wasn't a trade unit, because I wasn't a Catholic, when they came for me, by that time, no one was left to speak up. It is a very emotional thing with me because I lived at the time that all of this came out and we realized what had happened. And I am sorry that Senator Chambers is opposing it. But I will close by saying that I hope when the angels come to greet me that they will say, thank you, you tried to do something about those things that were wrong, you didn't just
