

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Is there any further discussion of the Wehrbein amendment? Seeing none, the question before you is the adoption of the Wehrbein amendment to the committee amendments to LR 81. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Wehrbein's amendment to the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Wehrbein amendment is adopted. Is there any discussion or further discussion of the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Robinson to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the adoption of the committee amendments to LR 81. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The committee amendments are adopted. Is there anything further on the resolution?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the resolution, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any further discussion on LR 81? Senator...Senator Wehrbein, do you wish to open on LR 81 at this time? Waive opening?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I...the bill...the committee amendments have become the bill. I don't know that there's any new discussion. I urge the passage of the resolution.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I support this resolution, as I stated, but I have to make a comment or two in response to what Senator Crosby had said because it kind of goes to my attitude toward these resolutions. The way that resolution was drafted...I have a box of books on my desk. It talks about the publication and dissemination of Nazi propaganda. Everyone of these books, which I have on shelves, and similar books would constitute a violation of that resolution. I would have to be condemned.
