

and only after that was the man fired. But he can attack these two nonwhite women. This Governor, that you all want to entrust in this way, he cannot discharge his constitutional and statutory duty which are mandated, but he can attack two nonwhite women. He cannot go after the white SS worker, for you all it's DSS, but the SS was the Schutzstaffel of the Nazis, and because of their practices, which were illegal and extralegal under a system such as this but legal in Nazi Germany because the laws were written to justify what they did, carried on a type of conduct with which civilized people disagree. And I think that often happens at the DSS so I just drop the D and whenever you hear me refer to the SS Department, I'm talking about what you all call the DSS. There were disputes, Senator Hillman, that the Governor had...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...and dissatisfaction with Larry Myers. So the Governor didn't just step into this with his hands clean. A principle of equity is that he or she who seeks equity must come with clean hands or cannot come with unclean hands. The Governor's hands are unclean. I do not trust him or any other governor in the area of fighting discrimination when I have concrete cases of his moral cowardice and his unwillingness to discharge his duty under the constitution and I'm going to see how much you all believe in the constitution and law should I bring those resolutions of impeachment.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, there's really two issues about this bill that I can see. There's the one issue on the bill itself, why the bill itself is before us, and the specifics of this bill itself. And this amendment speaks to the specifics of this bill. And I would seek to do away with Section 21 allowing the Governor to appoint an all new commission at this time as soon as this bill is passed. My reasons for doing so is there...there are no recommendations in the executive summary. I've read through the executive summary and some of the rest of this report on the EEOC. Senator Hillman talks about it being an appropriations issue, an early appropriations issue. Here's one, one paragraph, in 1965 the Nebraska Legislature created the EEOC to enforce Nebraska Fair Employment Practice Act, that was in 1965. Since that time, as
