So a total, totally ineffective commission is worse than no commission at all because it puts an impediment in the path of those who would want to file a complaint directly with the federal government or go directly into court. They'll be run around the track and made to jump through all these hoops of this totally political association, become increasingly embittered, and you all need to read more and more of these articles where you see more and more instances of people who were employed and lose their jobs, going getting a firearm, which Senator Schmitt wants to let everybody carry, and they come back and kill the boss and kill employees too. That's because they feel there is no redress and people sitting out here on the Plains of Nebraska feel like those things can never happen. Human nature is the same on the Plains of Nebraska as it is the heart of New York City. Sometimes there's a different manifestation of the bitterness, the anger, and the hostility and frustration. But festering out there in what could be called the hinterlands right now is a movement of people, and I've talked to some of them in my office and some of them I worked with during the farm crisis, who don't want to recognize the validity of the...
