We're going to have some knock-down-drag-outs and I intend to contribute my part, not just on this bill but on others. And depending on what happens to this bill, if you get on the fighting side of me as people have always said, then we'll just let that govern what the whole session is going to be like. Again, though, I'm offended when I see white men in positions of power like your Governor attacking a black woman and a Latino woman over at the Equal Opportunity Commission. That's how he shows his bravery and his courage, he attacks two women. Bold, a visionary,...

SPEAKER WITHEM: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...a leader of society, a role model for young men. Look what they said about Lawrence Phillips and a lot of the things they said they should have because I don't believe that a man ought to use violence against a woman under any circumstances or on any other person who is weaker than that man. Not just women, not just adults, but children. The cruelty shouldn't even be shown to animals. But see how he was attacked? But when your Governor, your hero, your leader, your paragon, your example, your paradigm attacks two nonwhite women, silent night in this state. I'm going to support Senator Witek's amendment.

SENATOR WITEK: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I'm going to again draw your attention to the responses of the commission to the recommendations in this summary report. It's, it's really an eye opening experience for me to even be involved in some of these areas because it's not a traditional area, especially being more of a probusiness person. But I can even see it from the point of probusiness how this would be damaging because this is a commission that is, that is out there to investigate discrimination. And many times businesses are involved in those, in those investigation, individuals, housing, whatever
