And I think it's perceived generally as in some cases a nuisance maybe, or a potentially very...it can really entangle you in a long-term investigation, et cetera, so businesses turn away from it. But I think businesses should also be aware of the political potential of this agency and bringing it underneath a more political wing because I can see the potential for abuse of using the EEOC with a board that's appointed entirely by this Governor of, of wanting compliance from...I'm not saying that this is possible with this Governor, I'm saying that this is possible, of wanting compliance for one reason or another or wanting to investigate someone or entangle someone up or wanting to find out more about the person that's running against you, possibly, and going to the EEOC saying, hey, could you look into this person's, he or she's business practices and report back to us what you find. That's what happens. That happens now. And maybe that commissioner would say no. And maybe, maybe that you'd start some harassment here, maybe you'd even entangle the Legislature a little bit in that harassment because that person is not doing what you want them to do and they're not...you appointed him and you wanted him to be one way or another and kind of report back to you. And this is the potential that's out there. These are the potential things that can happen when you bring all this into the political arena because politics is a contact sport, as we all know. And we can involve people into that contact sport. And generally they try to ignore us or stay out of it, or make...keep us happy so we don't kind of look in their direction. It's like everybody not looking at the field goal kicker when he's ready to kick the field goal. You know, you don't want to jinx him, you want to make sure he gets that there. It's the same kind of feeling I get sometimes in politics, that people don't really want to look at you as a politician because they don't want you to look at them unnecessarily and maybe bring some of these areas of government to bear. But it's there. It's a potential and it's there and we're making it even more political if, when you pass this bill. You can see from the responses of the commission that it's already been made very political by this Governor and this commission, and he didn't like it. And that's why I think he's pushing for this bill. First bill up on our agenda. Maybe it was the first one in the order of things to happen. But it's the first bill up and you can bet it's going to be on this floor and there's going to be some push, there already has been some push to have it adopted. If you read through some of the
