Senator Schimek, could you please check in. Senator Beutler, could you please check in. Senator Klein, could you please check in. Senator Robak, could you check in, please. Senator Avery, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Brashear, Senator Bohlke, Senator Crosby, Senator Schrock, Senator Stuhr and Senator Landis. Senator Avery. Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: (Microphone not activated.) ...for a roll call vote and we can start now.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Okay, a roll call vote has been requested. Senator Chambers has authorized us to proceed. Senator...or, Mr. Clerk, please call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 235 of the Legislative Journal.) 6 ayes, 34 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is not adopted. Call is raised. Mr. Clerk, next item.
