CLERK: 11 ayes, 17 nays on the adoption of the amendment to the committee amendments.

SENATOR CROSBY: The amendment fails. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator Chambers would move to amend the committee amendments, Madam President.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Clerk, and members of the Legislature, in the interest of trying to save on paper, these amendments are relatively brief, so I will ask the Clerk if he would read this one.

CLERK: On page 7, line 25 of the committee amendments, after the word "may"...page 7, line 25, after the word "may" insert "personally, by an agent or attorney".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And members of the Legislature, the reason I wanted it read so that it's a matter of record, and I am going to ask a question of Senator Warner. Senator Warner, are you on page 7 of the committee amendment because maybe this language has been reinstated someplace else?

SENATOR WARNER: I just asked, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is it reinstated someplace else, or is it just being taken out? Under...the language which is being stricken is that which would allow a person to do it, the person's agent, or the person's attorney to file a complaint with the commission. While Senator Warner is checking this out, I will tell you why I am bringing this. There are people who try to bring these complaints and they don't feel proficient in writing it out or putting it together on their own, and if this language which is stricken remains stricken, if the person who is aggrieved does not write the complaint himself or herself, it cannot be filed apparently. So I am asking this question of Senator Warner because I did not see in my reading of the committee amendment where that type of language has been
