PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Warner. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I made it clear in the beginning also, that regardless of what they do with this bill, as long as the Governor is given control I will be in opposition to it. But it is good that Senator Warner placed into the record the intent to see that some of those things we had discussed would be taken care of. And I know that they will be, because once he gives the order, and he is carrying the water today, all the legislators are going to go along with it anyway. And that's how legislating is done, Senator Hilgert, and Senator Klein. When somebody is doing something for the Governor, once that person says it's all right for the senators to do something and they get that permission, then they go ahead and do it. And that's what's happening on this bill. It's why some very serious issues that need to be dealt with are not being dealt with. It's why language which is inappropriate and admitted by those who put the language in that it is contradictory, it is self-contradictory, nevertheless will not allow it to be taken out, because they own the legislation, they are going to show the legislators that they can't do anything if they don't get permission. But, as you can see, I'm like one of those obedient children, and I don't do what they tell me to do when what they tell me to do is not right or it lacks rationality. And I believe that the discrimination that occurs against people who are gay lacks rationality. I had talked about Michaelangelo, and I'm not going to go through all of that, but look at the talent and the ability that he had. Very recently there was a woman who had risen through the ranks of the military, and I don't remember if she was a general or she was being considered for a promotion to general, and they asked her a question related to sexual orientation. And I forget how the question was phrased, but when you're in the military aren't you supposed to be an honorable person? Isn't
