SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, he will base that mailing on filings he already has in his office.

SENATOR DIERKS: I believe so.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And, if somebody has not made one of those filings in his office that person or entity will not get one of these forms.

SENATOR DIERKS: That is my understanding of it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there a penalty for any of those, no I don't want to go off into that, let me stay with what the bill is. Now, if the Secretary of State fails to mail one of these to somebody, in other words, how will there be proof given that the Secretary of State in fact mailed one of these forms to each of these entities? Will it be by certified mail with a return receipt request required?
