SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator, I do but I don't have them organized right at the moment.

SENATOR DIERKS: Okay, well...

SENATOR BEUTLER: Maybe after lunch.

SENATOR DIERKS: What I'd like to...we aren't going to have lunch today.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Oh, we're not?

SENATOR DIERKS: I don't believe. The thing that I'd like to mention and Senator Matzke mentioned it a little bit ago, too, that we do intend, if this bill is successful on General File, to bring that change on the corporate date and try to get it incorporated into some of the same forms that come with the corporate occupation tax. That's part of our intent. We didn't bring that amendment for General File. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Dierks. Senator Wehrbein, on the Hillman amendment.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Mr. Speaker, member, I simply wanted to assure Senator Dierks I'm supporting this, but I am very interested in making this as simple and as clean-cut as possible so it doesn't add to the burden of paperwork. I've talked to assistant to the Secretary of State, Mr. Lemon, that they feel they can...I don't know whether you worked with them or discussed it with them or not, but I asked him to...this form ought to be something that can be fairly simple to put out so that it is understandable, others can...you can simply check things. Are you subject to Initiative 300? Those kinds of questions, I'm not prepared to get into details. I do know this brings in limited partnerships, which I do not think are presently registered at the Secretary of State level. I'm not clear on that, but I don't think so. But there will be a lot of resistance to this if it really adds to the paperwork, and I don't want to do that. And I've got the forms here that we presently file. We got them last week, for those that have
