PRESIDENT ROBAK: The question before the body is the adoption of the first section of the committee amendments to LB 584. All those in favor vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of the first component of the committee amendments.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The first component of the committee amendments is adopted. Senator Beutler, to open on the second section.

CLERK: Senator, just again if I may?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay.

CLERK: Floor Amendment 235 begins on page 3 of what was originally AM1189. It includes Section 3 and goes all the way over to page 15, line 21. (See FA235 on pages 300-07 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR BEUTLER: That's right.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Madam President, members of the Legislature, again to reorient you, this is Senator Wehrbein's bill, originally, LB 198, if that reference helps you any, and it has to do with the process of a particular kind of permit called a limited permit. It's a permit that's available at a reduced cost and under varying conditions, conditions that can be outlined by Game and Parks for property owners or those who lease from property owners when they're hunting on their own land. And, with that, I will switch to Senator Wehrbein and allow him to describe to you the changes that folks wish to make, that he wishes to make to those particular provisions.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Wehrbein, you have nine minutes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, Madam Speaker, member, this is on page 12, is the one I'm particularly concerned with. Senator Wickersham wants to speak to some of this also, but my particular one, I've had some interest in my area particularly of excessive amount of deer and so we worked out a situation.
