

before in 1994. That bill was LB 900 as I mentioned. It dealt with public health clinics and their ability to have drug dispensing permits and education and training requirements for those individuals within those public health clinics and the work that they did. The bill was already passed and there wasn't a proper reference in this bill. We missed it because the other bill passed just the year before so all this does is reference back to that existing statute.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Thank you, Senator Wesely, and with that explanation, I certainly am supportive of the amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Bernard-Stevens. Any further discussion on the Wesely amendment? Seeing none, Senator Wesely to close. Closing is waived. The question before the body is the adoption of the Wesely amendment to the committee amendments to LB 414. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Wesely amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Bernard-Stevens now has an amendment. Senator, your amendment to the committee amendments on page 2, striking lines 12-19.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Pull it.

CLERK: Okay.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: It is withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further to the committee amendments, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Any further discussion on the committee amendments? Seeing none, Senator Wesely to close.
