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that are being attempted while we're amending the rules will not be of interest to most of the senators at the time we're doing it. Most senators wish that we could just move right along and finish up with the rules. I don't want to move right along. I want us to be deliberative. I want us to take as much time as available under the rules to get these types of things dealt with. I didn't make a motion to reconsider that last vote, which I lost, because my goal in discussing these rules is to get us to focus on what it is that we're doing so that when it comes back to haunt us then I will be able to mock and taunt and scoff. So when I say MTS, that's not a play on MTV, it means mock, taunt, scoff, and I won't have to keep saying the three words. It will give me a chance to enter my MTS mode, and I assure you that I will do it. I have no concern whatsoever about anybody's attitude with reference to what I do when I believe what I am doing is right. I think what I'm doing here is eminently right. It will bring truth, it will illuminate this hall in which we legislate, Senator Bromm. It will show that people who discussed the matter earlier did not intentionally mislead us, it just did not occur to them to do what I'm doing, and that's to put language in the amendment that would do what they say their goal is. If you adopt this amendment that I'm offering it will not skin Senator Wickersham's cat, it will not weaken what he claims his main intention is. I do have to say that if I remember correctly it was Senator Will who introduced a serious discussion about the committee system and how an amendment such as that, that Senator Wickersham is proposing to us, will strengthen that system. Let me ask Senator Vrtiska a question.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Vrtiska, will you respond?

SENATOR VRTISKA: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Vrtiska, when you mentioned questioning me earlier, you used plural on questions and only asked me one. I'm using the singular and saying I'm going to ask you a question, but I'll acknowledge I may have to ask you more than one, based on how you answer. How do you feel about the amendment that I'm offering? Will you support it? That's what I'm asking you, which says that this 30-vote requirement will apply only to bills killed in committee.
