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both feet. This that we're dealing with regarding the rules is really small potatoes in a sense, because it's not going to make any difference. All it does is require more than one step to be taken to achieve a result, but the result is still achievable. During all of the years that I've been in this Legislature things have never been easy for me, so I don't expect them to become easy now. We've become strong by doing difficult things. Nature equips her children to survive in a hostile environment. A tortoise on the desert has that heavy, thick, tough shell to protect it against the elements and the creatures which would be a threat to its existence. One of those jellyfish...

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...in the water does not have the shell because the jellyfish does not face the same type of predatory enemies. And I would rather take for my example, the toughness of the tortoise than the softness and shifting quality of the jellyfish. So, I intend to continue doing what I think ought to be done with the rules and offering recommendations and amendments. This one that I'm offering comports with what earlier those who support Senator Wickersham's proposal gave as the rationale for supporting it.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. You may continue.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Another reason our discussion this morning is significant, I think it's going to set the tone for some discussions on other issues that we will face as we move along. I want to say again in case anybody has forgotten it I'm not down here to win friends, I'm not down here to cheese up to or please any of the legislators. It's nice if we can get along, but I'm never going to go along to get along. And what I ought to start doing, but I won't threaten it because I've said it before but I can't carry through on it, when some of you all come to me because you're tangled up on the rules, or you're trying to put an amendment together, I should run you to Senator Will, or Senator Wickersham, or Senator Vrtiska, they're your leaders on the rules. So if they're the ones you follow, in terms of laying out the rules, go to them when you have a problem with the rules, go to them when you have a question about how to draft an amendment, go to them when you have a question as to what an amendment means. But you all know that
