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the same as that kill bill to another bill by way of amendment.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That is correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The crucial player in this whole thing is the Speaker who would make a determination as to whether the proposed amendment is substantially the same as the kill bill.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Subject to a motion to overrule.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The Speaker is the key player in making the determination as to whether or not the proposal, the proposed amendment is substantially the same as the kill bill, is that true or false?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Subject to a motion to overrule the Chair.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The Chairpers...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The body ultimately Senator Chambers, the body never gives anyone complete power. I have never seen this chamber give anyone complete power. We always reserve to ourselves the final decision.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You have given me power over the Legislature.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: I have had some power from time to time but it is fleeting in illusory.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll grant that every now and then because I don't want to seem like a total tyrant. Thank you Senator Wickersham. What I want in...by way of the final discussion of this to make it clear, what this amendment is that Senator Wickersham is offering to the rules. It does leave it in the discretion of the speaker. I do believe, and I say it categorically and I apply it to whoever has been in the chair. I have seen instances where in my opinion pressure was brought to bear on who sat in the chair to rule in a certain way. I believe that this amendment that Senator Wickersham is offering invites that kind of pressure and I believe that it will be brought to bear and I believe that it will be successful. I believe further that there will be acrimonious debates, arguments and wranglings because of this rule. I believe that it is an invitation to chaos and I believe further that chaos
