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it will be a very helpful change. I don't think it is controversial in the least bit and I would hope that you would vote for it. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you Senator Witek. Senator Chambers. Excuse me Senator Chambers, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator, just a moment if I may, excuse me. Health and Human Services Committee in Exec Session in Room 2022, Health Committee in Room 2022 now in Exec Session. Thank you.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you Mr. Clerk. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I would like to ask Senator Witek a question.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator Witek.

SENATOR WITEK: Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Witek, in the last sentence where it says, The text of each amendment shall either be printed in the daily Journal or noted in the daily Journal as on file in the Bill Room or the Clerk's Office, who makes the determination as to whether it is printed or a notation is made that it is on file.

SENATOR WITEK: I would imagine that that would be up to the senator and besides I think generally too the Clerk's Office suggests when we have a big amendment that we can go ahead and just note it and have it filed in his office.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Right, and on the large amendments I think there is no question about that whatsoever. But, you mean if a senator has an amendment that would change one word the senator could say, I don't want this printed in the Journal, I just want you to make a notation that I offered an amendment and it is on file with the Clerk.

SENATOR WITEK: Reasonably yes, they could do that. Which right now they don't have to have it printed at all Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That I understand. But, if.. well let me hear what the goal of this is again.
