occur. If you adopted the language that I am talking about where anything under ten pages would have to be printed, all of those would have to be printed even if the senator would chose not to take them up. So, the issue is whether notification is so important that even if a senator later on would decide not to actually pursue those amendments they should be printed. My inclination is that they should. Because, there is always the possibility that the senator may decide to go ahead and take them up, in which case I would opt for the notice being there and the senator being the one, when time came to consider the amendments to say, I don't want to take up this one or that one. This is just, so to speak, flying by the seat of my pants, how I feel on these.
