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I just say that because he has the power to harass the heck out of my amendment like he has done on the other ones, so I want to make sure that doesn't happen. This is not a harassing amendment he is doing here and I hope members who are not on the floor realize that and understand that this amendment actually does make this amendment better and it does make it even more workable for those of us who are tracking these amendments because you will immediately know then if an amendment is lengthy or not by the... it wouldn't be printed in the Journal, it would be in the Clerk's Office, so there would be no decision there, it would be automatic and it would be printed if it was less than ten pages and... in the Clerk's Office and printed if it were more than ten pages so it actually makes this amendment better and I think anything we can do to improve the process and make us better informed as we approach any of these bills on the floor, it is very helpful to me and it is very helpful to the staff people too. I know that it will take a little extra time within the Clerk's Office and I appreciate the time that they will be doing to do this for us, but it helps the process and I think everybody would agree to do so. So, I hope that people realize that this is a good amendment to this amendment and vote for it. Thank you.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you Senator Witek. Senator Withem please.

SPEAKER WITHEM: I hate to interrupt a love feast of this nature that doesn't happen all that often in here, but I do have some procedural questions about this. They are not enough to cause me to cast a no vote, but there are some questions, Senator Will and Senator Chambers that I would like some answers to maybe before we get to the final vote to adopt the permanent rules. Those are, this sounds reasonable to me, but it sounds to me like we might as legislators entering the realm of micromanagement where we are specifying the length of amendments without really knowing what this involves. So what I would hope we could do is prior to the final vote adopt the permanent rules. And, that could come fairly quickly because I know this next rule is going to be fairly noncontroversial, probably be adopted on a voice vote even, and then we will get on to, no seriously I know we won't get to that motion today so I would hope that we might have some discussions with the Clerk's Office, Bill Drafters Office, the Bill Room to talk about the mechanics of this. I guess one question that comes to my mind
