SENATOR CROSBY: ...think is a good idea. But if they're all still going to be down here in the eastern part of the state I'm not sure what that does for the overall health picture. So I haven't said anything productive in what I've said, all I'm saying is I still have a problem, I don't know how to vote on this amendment, so maybe David Landis, you could stand up again and try to convince me. So I do want to do the right thing and who knows what that is today. Thank you.
