SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay. Now what are the others that the state...?

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Well, the others, the state plan, the county plan, we also have statutory parameters for first class cities, et cetera, for firefighters,...

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, but what we are saying...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: ...for police...

SENATOR PIRSCH: ...is that those state employees that are judges, school employees, or Patrol employees are what we're dealing with in this combined effort.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Most participants in the school employees plan are not state employees.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Oh, right. But I mean we are responsible for all these school employees other than the Omaha Public School, is that not correct, in the retire...in managing retirement funds.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: The state of Nebraska sets the statutory parameters for the plan.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Right.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: We define all the aspects of the plan including the contribution rate.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: But there's only a very limited amount of state funding that goes into the School Retirement System. More significant amounts of state funding go into the Patrol and the judges system because there we are the employees...or employers, I'm sorry.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, well that raises then the question that we, we pick these three, how then will it be different in the cost-of-living adjustments from what the present picture is now,
