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district to school district, not because of the number of employees but because of the impact of 1059.

SENATOR BROMM: A million and a half dollars statewide...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: ..of local contribution difference.

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: Yes.

SENATOR BROMM: But again, and I understand what you're saying, the 1059 impact changes so that might...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: You'd have to give me an individual school district to let...so I could tell you what the true net dollar impact was on a given school district.

SENATOR BROMM: So some of that cost a local school district will wind up really being reimbursed by the state through the 1059 reimbursement...

SENATOR WICKERSHAM: That's correct.

SENATOR BROMM: ..formula. Okay. Thank you, Senator Wickersham.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Bromm. Senator Pedersen, followed by Senator Crosby.

SENATOR PEDERSEN: Question.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question before the body, is shall debate now cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. All of you wishing to vote on the motion to cease debate, have you in fact cast your vote? Question before the body now is, shall debate now cease? Record, Mr. Clerk.
