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can't...there are no motions to override or the Speaker can do this without Exec Board approval, et cetera, et cetera, then you would have that kind of case. But you don't under the structure of this amendment in my opinion. And I really liked Pam's language, commonly understood process, which is a clearly understood process which is commonly understood. That really is a very good summary of what this is all about in my opinion. Thank you.

SENATOR CROSBY: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President and members of the Legislature, I was here when the ConAgra bill was brought before us and I know how hard the lobbyists worked to try to get amendments jumped ahead of other amendments. As a matter of fact, there was so much disputing on that bill, and not that alone, and others, questions began to be raised as to whether chicanery was taking place in the Clerk's Office in terms of listing when amendments were filed to put some ahead of others because of strong interest groups that were involved. So we have had problems already in terms of how amendments are going to be taken based on the order in which they are presented. I am going to continue to emphasize the aspect that I spoke of earlier. There are people on this floor who couldn't care less about what happens to the constituency that I believe it is my obligation to represent. That constituency extends beyond the people who live in my geographic legislative district. Because those constituencies, and I am going to make them plural now, do not have representation on this floor because they lack the numbers or the clout to elect somebody, if it were not for a person such as myself willing to bring their issues to the Legislature, they would be the invisible nonpeople as far as legislative activity is concerned. I am not the first individual to be a part of a legislative assembly which is basically racist in its orientation, which is class conscious, which is elitist in terms of those whose interest they take a concern, but I doubt that there has ever been a person in that position who has been as determined as I am, who will be as unyielding as I shall be, who will be as relentless as I intend to be. I had made a concession to Senator Brown yesterday which I am thinking about reneging on. I never am in the Legislature when that public act of public worship occurs called the prayer by the chaplain. I understand you are going to have another act of public worship today when God actually comes to the
