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Legislature in the form of Tom Osborne. I had said that I wouldn't challenge that or make an issue of it. I am beginning to change my mind and I am going to look at these rules and make sure now that every single thing done by this Legislature is in accord not with what we call the spirit of the rules, I want to be shown a rule that allows that. And if you show me a rule that I think doesn't allow it, we are going to debate that rule, and in the course of debating that rule, I hope the things are said that will make the individual decide that it would be best for them not to come here and be that lightning rod and cause such contention on the floor of the Legislature. Oh, I know how to make trouble. You make trouble for me, I am going to give it back to you. I ask no quarter and I will give none. And for those of you who don't know the technical significance of that term, in the laws of war, quarter is given to noncombatants,...

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to civilians, and certain other categories because the philosophy or the theory is that wars occur between nations and not individuals, that those who fight the wars fight them not even as citizens of their country but as defenders. So the war is between soldiers, but in order to civilize it to some extent there are principles involved and one of those is to give quarter, meaning that certain hostile actions will not be taken against certain protected groups. But no quarter need be given when to give that quarter endangers the safety and welfare of those who are combatants. So I feel that we are all combatants here. Everything is a hostile relationship. I ask no quarter. I will give none. I am going to battle all of you where I think it is necessary and I may have to start with God this morning.

SENATOR CROSBY: Time. Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Bernard-Stevens. Senator David, I'm smiling at you.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: I just couldn't. Your eyes mesmerized me, Senator Crosby. I just couldn't take my eyes off you this morning. Senator Chambers, I am supporting your viewpoint. However, sometimes I wish you wouldn't speak on the issue because it doesn't make it any easier to defeat. It makes it more difficult, but that's neither here nor there. Senator Beutler, a couple of things I wanted to comment on on your comments. Senator Beutler talks about so many checks, well, there are so many checks in this. Why are we doing it then? I
