He had time to meet with them. But when black people came down here yesterday to talk to him about what he's doing with the NEOC he had no time to meet with them. That's what I'm talking about. You all are not in a position to view him and judge him as I do because he doesn't do to you what he does to us. He's been able to show disrespect and disregard, but he's not going to do it while I'm here without me talking about it and I want black people to know when the sucker comes in our community or sends his Negro stooges among us to remind him how he had no time for us on this important issue. So what if Hagel wins? Hagel is the one who's going to run against him. We know that. Stenberg can't win. If there were one million lottery tickets sold and you gave Don Stenberg 999,000 of them, he wouldn't win the lottery. He can't. He's a loser. You all know it and I know it. He's happy that an "also ran", no, not an "also ran", a "didn't run" endorsed him, a "didn't run", Senator Witek. This guy didn't even run and he endorsed Stenberg and Stenberg is ecstatic. This guy said, well, I'm not going to run against him; I don't have the time or the money. So Stenberg got a "never run" to endorse him and he's happy.

SENATOR CROSBY: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it will be the would-be little Caesar who sits in the Governor's office now running against Hagel, and what difference does it make to black people whether Hagel gets to be the U.S. Senator or Governor vanilla? Makes no difference to us. I'll do everything I can to see that he's defeated and I hope it's a close race. And that doesn't mean I like what Hagel says. He's just like Don Stenberg and Jon Christensen from our position. But if there's anything that we can do to exert some political muscle we must do that because we're totally left out of the equation and, although I can't put us in it, I've got to make it as difficult for you as possible to leave us out of it.
