PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Madam President, members of the Legislature, I have offered a substitute for what Senator Beutler just discussed, and the reason I'm offering a substitute motion is because of the fact that Senator Maurstad's amendment had not been adopted at the time I drafted these others that are pending now. And I will tell you what the substitute is, and I have to get your agreement to make the substitution, or it cannot be made. But if it is not made or allowed to be made at this time, I won't take offense because I can just put it at the bottom of the list and take it up at that point. What this substitute amendment would do is wipe out what we have just been discussing, that would be taken...I meant what Senator Beutler mentioned as the form of the amendment I have pending now. And this substitute would strike from this proposed rule change subdivision (b) and subdivision (2), which relate to instructions to the committee or efforts to get the committee chair to agree with the Speaker that certain actions ought to be taken with reference to a bill that has been designated a major proposal. So, what I am requesting is a substitution to be made, so that what I just mentioned will be substituted for what Senator Beutler just discussed as my pending amendment that would require unanimous consent of the Executive Board to the Speaker's designation of a major proposal.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Is there any objection to the substitution of the amendment?

SENATOR BEUTLER: I object.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Very well.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: There is an objection.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like that amendment then put at the bottom of the list of what I have up there, and I will discuss what's before us now.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Senator, you have a two and a half minutes left.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. The amendment that is before us
