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don't think that rule will apply to the adoption of the permanent rules. It's like any bill we have before us that, once the bill is there, it is amendable in it...as long as you're amending a part that is before you and, in this case, the part that will be before us at the end will be the entire Rule Book, that we have with the exception of the changes that we have amended as provided by the rules. And so, consequently, it's not necessarily a new rule that would go to the Rules Committee. It is an amendment to an existing rule that is before the Legislature brought to us by the Rules Committee as we adopt all of the rules at that point, and it will be a procedural question we may have to discuss later and I'll be willing to sit down with you here between now and Tuesday and see if we can at least get into the realm of what the portion would or would not do, and I appreciate the dialogue.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Will, our records up here indicate you've spoken three times. Is that...? I believe that's correct. Senator Maurstad, you're recognized. Senator Will, Senator Maurstad has yielded the time to you.

SENATOR WILL: Thank you, Senator Maurstad. I appreciate that. Just, Senator Bernard-Stevens, are you still in the chamber? I just...I wanted to, just for the record, to continue our dialogue just a little longer. In essence, do I understand your argument to be that since we are on a motion, we're operating now under temporary rules and since we...the motion before us is to adopt permanent rules and in essence we...each of these proposed rules changes is kind of an amendment to that motion. Right? So, in essence, you're saying we have the rules in their entirety, as in our possession, in front of us as if it were a legislative bill and the rules, in your mind, are such that they have what amounts to a sunset clause on them, that they sunset with the end of each legislative session, and then need...as if they were a bill, need to be reenacted in their entirety and that's the way that they should be treated, so any portion thereof is amendable from the floor? Okay, I just wanted to understand, to get that in the record. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close. Thought maybe you'd lost interest in this whole debate and had gone.
