

PRESIDENT ROBAK: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...have been introduced and addressed by the body, that we lay out where we believe we are going to go and be more specific, but at this point being more specific seems to me at the beginning of the discussion would be premature, and for those reasons, I will not be supporting this amendment, but I think it does very specifically spells out one of the things that in the long term we need to be thinking of.

SENATOR ROBINSON: Madam President, members of the body, I stand to oppose the Beutler amendment, and I asked Senator Beutler what's more kind, saying I am not going to vote for it or should I say I'm going to oppose it. So I am going to use those gruff words, opposing, and, basically, what Senator Warner said is correct. If Senator Beutler wants to get this into the mix, he should put a bill in, and if we would put this bill into the resolution, we should put Senator Withem's bill in on the reduction of spending, we should put Senator Warner's bill in, which is basically very close to what Senator Beutler's bill is, and we also should be the Governor's, someone should amend the Governor's bill into this proposition. And, Senator Berrard-Stevens, no one ever said that we were going to do everything. Did you hear that, Senator Stevens? No one ever said we're going to do everything in that resolution. They were ideas. There isn't anyone that believes every thing in that resolution, not one person. Senator Withem doesn't. I don't. Senator Hartnett doesn't. There are things that we want to change. I am carrying a bill on townships. I got...every county I have has townships. You bet I am not going to look at it real carefully? You bet I am going to, but I don't believe, as Senator Beutler said, someone would get up and say we don't need this...these specific things in there, and I'm the one that's saying it. We don't need it, but his idea is good, and I think it will come out in the bills that we have. If Senator Beutler doesn't have a bill, he could amend it onto another proposition that comes before us. So I stand to oppose the Beutler amendment. Thank you.
