If you don't think it's a good policy, you'll overrule. If we're still under call, Mr. President, I would just ask that we check in. And on this one I would like to get a roll call vote.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Thank you. There's been a request for the senators to check in. I'd ask the senators to please check in. Senator Witek, could you check in, please. Senator Beutler. Senators have all checked in. There...there's been a request for a roll call in random order did you say? No, in reverse order, that would be different. Roll call vote in reverse order. It will take 23 votes. The question is, shall the Chair be overruled? Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 423 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 24 nays on the motion to overrule.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The Chair is overruled, excuse me, is not overruled. (Laughter) The question is the adoption of the Withem amendment. All those.... He had requested a roll call vote so, Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 424 of the Legislative Journal.) 4 ayes, 33 nays on the amendment.

SENATOR LINDSAY: The motion fails. Mr. Clerk, are there items on the desk?

CLERK: There are, Mr. President.
