SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, there has been so little discussion of this proposal because it is easy to understand in terms of what it says and in terms of what it does. There is nothing radical or liberal about it. So I hope there will be enough members to adopt it. But on the chance that we lack sufficient numbers in the Chamber at this point, I'm going to ask the Speaker, may I request a call of the house.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to place the house under call.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The house is under call. Members, return to the Chamber and record your presence. Senator Avery, Senator Beutler, Senator Lynch, please record your presence. Senator Warner, Senator Schellpeper, Senator Wehrbein, Senator Wesely. Senator Chambers, all the members are present that are not excused. The question is, shall the Chambers amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted that care to vote? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Roll call vote.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Question is, shall the Chambers amendment be adopted? All of those in favor...excuse me, the roll call vote has been requested. Mr. Clerk, call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 444 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 2 nays on the amendment. Mr. President.

SPEAKER WITHEM: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, call is raised. Mr. Clerk, next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers would move to amend proposed rule number 6, in paragraph (a), in the second sentence strike "20th" and insert "15th".

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would withdraw that.
