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here on the floor, because each one of us...I went to a meeting last night with some people who are very disturbed about a bill that's coming up on Select File, and I am going to try to work out some amendments to see if we can't help them feel that it's a better bill. The perception is they think it's going to compound the problem that they have instead of helping it. What's wrong with that? That's the way our system works. No one person, the Governor, President, no one person in this United States of America can stand up and say, you are going to change thus and so. That's not the way our system works. We have three branches of government and each one dwells on the other...impacts on the other. So, I'll vote for Bernard-Stevens reconsideration and I will vote for his amendment. I still will not support this rule change. I think it is a pernicious change. I don't think we should be doing this. I really am very agitated concerning the whole change. And, Senator Chambers, remember that song, "They call him the great pretender?" We'll call you the great amender. Thank you.

SPEAKER WITHEM: Thank you, Senator Crosby. Senator Avery.

SENATOR AVERY: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I haven't spoke on this. I've been, I guess, listening and trying to determine what...which way is the best way for the body. Like many others, I am frustrated, as well, in not being able to touch all the bases of the legislation that we have to deal with. I'm not so sure that this would help the process. But in terms of what I would like, I guess, to maybe ask Senator Will if he would maybe address it in terms of priority on amendments. If the Speaker is allowed this, will an individual, say, the introducer of an amendment, have a priority, or will that be set down in terms of the priority of amendments the Speaker determines needs to be talked about?

SENATOR WILL: It would under this. On a major proposal, Senator Avery, the Speaker would determine the order of amendments without regard to the rules that ordinarily would apply. So the Speaker would determine that, to answer your question.

SENATOR AVERY: So the introducer say, has an amendment, that would be set as...potentially could be set aside for other...other amendments?
