

January 18, 1996 LB 894, 895

CLERK: LB 894, a bill introduced by the Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 3. It was referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President, and members of the body. LB 894 is a bill that corrects an internal reference to the constitution. A constitutional amendment in 1972 rewrote many of the sections in the constitution related to education. This would substitute the correct reference. I would recommend the advancement of LB 894. Thank you, Madam President.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: Thank you, Senator Coordsen. Is there any discussion of the advancement of LB 894? Seeing none, the question before...Senator Coordsen to close. Closing is waived. The question before you is the advancement of LB 894. All those in favor vote aye; all those opposed vote nay. Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the advancement of LB 894.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: LB 894 advances. LB 895.

CLERK: LB 895, a bill introduced by the Chairperson of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 3, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT ROBAK: The Chair recognizes Senator Coordsen.

SENATOR COORDSEN: Thank you, Madam President, members of the body. LB 895 contains several provisions. Section 84-502 provides certain duties for the Secretary of State. Subsection (5) therein describes duties related to session laws and journals. These duties are also covered by Section 49-501. This bill would harmonize those provisions. Subsection (6) is being struck because it is obsolete. The duty to print the laws and journals of the Legislature is placed on the Revisor of Statutes and the Clerk of the Legislature. The language in subsection (6) is, therefore, no longer needed. I would recommend the advancement of LB 895. Thank you, Madam President
